

**Gist of the Third Meeting of the
CDC Committee on Physical Education (2004-2005)
held on 29 April 2005**

1. The minutes of the last meeting held on 28 Jan 2005 were confirmed without amendment.
2. Communication with stakeholders: There were four meetings with critical friends, and three meetings with teachers from the Tai Po & North District, Tuen Mun, and Yuen Long. The participants of the meetings opined that the curriculum was comprehensive. Their major concerns were the supporting measures and the examination rubrics.
3. Report made by the Chairman of the CDC-HKEAA Committee on PE (Senior Secondary) on the draft consultation document:
 - Aims and objectives: Cross reference was made between these two.
 - Framework: The topic “China’s Sport Culture” was added. The tenth part, “Performance in Physical Activities”, was more clearly described.
 - Public assessment: Two physical activities and the element of physical fitness were included in the SBA which makes up 30% of the total marks. Two written papers were proposed, with one including optional questions.
 - Exemplars: Three exemplars were included to illustrate the learning and teaching of some topics.
4. Summary of discussion on different issues of the draft consultation document:
 - To better illustrate and stress the importance of Part IX (c) “Legal Aspect in PE, Sport and Recreation”, the sub-topics of liability and negligence would be separated into two bullet points.
 - To better categorize the sub-topics of feedback, an item on “intrinsic and extrinsic feedback” would be added in Part VII “Motor Learning and Sport Psychology”.
 - The terms of “Movement Analysis” and “Biomechanics” would be used in Part III.
5. The 5% of the total curriculum time for PE would be spelt out in the Other Learning Experiences in the second consultation. At the moment, a topic on PE and sport was proposed for the project in Liberal Studies. The development of Career Oriented Studies in PE would be depended on outside bodies such as the Hong Kong Olympic Academy.
6. Members agreed to recommend the draft consultation document to CDC for endorsement for the second consultation.
