

A. c. 


Preparing for the Student Learning Profile

Writing Personal Statements with Reflections on Lived Experiences

General Comments from university admission officers:

From Admission Officer 3:

- Knowledge about Faculty/ School/ Programme: Students have to show their sincerity by showcasing their knowledge about the Faculty/ School/ Programme that they are applying for. However, students should refrain from flattering the readers by exaggerating the accomplishments made by the Faculty/ School/ Programme.
- Background which nurtures his/her interest in a specific programme/ area: It is
 desirable for students to present a <u>reasonable</u> background which results in their
 interest in a specific programme/ area, e.g. I worked as an intern in a business
 company last year and since then I have discovered my interest in business.
- Reasons for choosing a certain university (a specific programme) amongst other programmes: By telling their stories, the applicants are also able to unroll their deeper knowledge about the programme. e.g. I want to study BBA program of a specific university because I am attracted by its focus on corporate social responsibility as well as the plentiful value-added opportunities. By joining BBA of that specific university, it is certain that I can develop myself as an ethical business leader.
- Samples carefully and systematically written: The attached samples are carefully
 and systematically written. In addition, a faculty member responded that students may
 consider writing the self-introduction in both English and Chinese to suit
 the expectations by various programmes.

From Admission Officer 4:

• In general, in a personal statement, we try to find out something about the applicant's personality, aspirations, and motivation/suitability for the program applied. A good essay should tell a story and have a clear focus, reveal passion and expose personality, show creativity and independent thinking so that after reading, a unique impression about the applicant is formed. We do also form an impression of an applicant by looking at whether there're careless errors and traits of sloppiness in the writing.

Comment:

Admission officer 1: An interesting presentation can certainly impress the Admission Officers.

Admission Officer 2:

This is an interesting self account presented in 3rd person which presents the achievements and participation of the student in different roles. The account is creative and projects the



dynamic and self-reflective character of the student. The account is supported with relevant details, and hence quite convincing.

Admission Officer 4:

The Example is basically alright, but contents could be made more precise and concise.

Connecting Live Experiences to Education Goals

On Social Science Example 2

I love raising questions. How do we live in our society? How do we behave under the current social system? Why traditional culture is important to our modern life? These are the questions I have always asked and I really enjoy finding out their answers. That's why I am interested in Social Science and Sociology as well as its rigorous and systemic way of studying the society.

I believe that not every question have a definite answer, especially those related to ethics, politics and human behaviour. I have experienced this through participating in debates. Being a member of the Chinese Debating Team, I have learnt how to collect useful information, how to analyze data, and in what way I should present my materials and how they can be made persuasively. More importantly, I have been trained to think systemically and respond logically. I am sure all these experience would be very helpful for being a Social Science student.

As a sociable and active student, I enjoy dealing with people. I really think there is somehow a specialty of knowledge about interactions with people. Perhaps communication is the key factor. Being elected by my schoolmates as a member of the Student Union, I got a lot of chances to get along with different people by taking up the role as External Vice Chairperson. According to my experience, arguments were from time to time unavoidable when we conducted planning of various activities, but a good communication skill had often helped us to come to a conclusion smoothly because it allowed sharing of ideas possible. I've also learnt how to cooperate with others. Human beings is a group of connected individuals, we can never live on our own.

Among various services in school, being the Chairperson of the Junior Police Call is a role I treasure most. Though I was only a junior form student then, I got a lot of exposure about the Police Force and the crime situation in Hong Kong. It was also the first time for me to realize my responsibility as a citizen. Since then, I develop a curiosity in things and public issues happening around me. The government, political groups, economy and the people's livelihood are all areas of interest. I observe people from different cultures, I try to understand why they do and the reason behind their actions and culture. These experiences attract me further towards the field of Social Science.

With all these activities I have participated, I am now becoming more independent and mature. I am able to make decisions in critical time and work effectively Moreover, I have acquired a valuable leadership skills and it could surely help me in the future.

I believe that university education is not really about job training. It helps us develop intellectual ability and expand our knowledge base. I hope that I can be one of the candidates you find suitable for your university.

Example 3

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Example 2 is very much better in comparison. Having said that, it can be shortened a bit and one suggestion – to bold the key position/responsibility the applicant has taken in his/her secondary school

In Example 3, the applicant shall elaborate a little bit more on his/her interest in Social Work. A generalized statement lacking breadth and depth.

In Example 4, the applicant can suggest one or two psychology books he/she has read before, giving evidence in support of his/her interest in psychology.

Admission Officer 2:

Example 2 is a well-structured self account which is illustrated with relevant and interesting examples. The specific details cited demonstrates that the writer has some understanding of the discipline hel she has selected. The account also shows how participation in different activities has contributed to the growth and development of the student.

Example 3 and 4 have a similar structure as Example 2 but both lack relevant, specific details. It is difficult to see from the vague statements that the writers have made that they have carefully considered their programme choice.



On Science Programs

Example 5

Photo-taking is my favorite hobby. I could really feel the connection between the nature and me. My targets can be animals and plants I met in parks and countryside. I took photos of them and paid attention to the morphology of these wonderful creatures. Usually I cannot tell what species they are, but the mere interest of taking a snapshot of them gives me a sense of satisfaction. If necessary, I may check their names reference books.

When I studied Biology in senior secondary level, I was assigned to do a project on "biodiversity". I spent about four months in preparation and finally, my work was highly appreciated by the teacher. The preparatory work was by no means easy, I read a lot about the issue, I studied proposals and critiques as solutions of the threats, I organized all these facts and supplemented them with appealing graphics. The project was a software that allows students and teachers to study biotechnology from various aspects. In fact, a 1000-word written report was the basic requirement. I spent much more than required on this project because I found my work meaningful. The experience fuels my determination to study Biology-related disciplines in my tertiary education. Through researches and in-depth study, I hope that I can contribute to creation of a better environment for us, and also for other species.

I think the creation of the universe is fantastic; it cannot be described by any expressions. Unfortunately, in public examination we can only get in touch with textbooks, but have limited chances to interact with our nature environment. We seldom get much experiences of practical work, field study and design experiments on our own. I aspire to explore the world of knowledge in the university.

Example 6

If I have chance to enter the University, I want to Chemistry or Biology. The reasons can be explained from different angles.

I still remember having the integrated science lessons when I was a S.1 student. It is my first time to approach science and discover my interest of science. Enjoying each lesson of integrated science, I filled with confidence of performing well in my first science form test. Unfortunately, I failed my science test, that absolutely lower my self-esteem and makes me feel frustrated. After that, I am determined to reach the higher level of science in order not to fail again. By going over the experiments I have done and the theories such as particle theory and motion theory, the more I have observed and I started to believe that science is different from other subjects such as Chinese and English. It trains our logical and critical thinking and it give us some reasons behind all the phenomena of nature. Science is such a mysterious and challenging subject that I have ever learnt. As a student of Chemistry and Biology, I hope I can use the knowledge I have learnt on discovering more and more wonderful theories and rare species of animals or plants so as to help our society get more improvements and understandings about nature. My mission is to investigate useful materials from biology or chemistry in order to raise the society's living standard and there is another crucial mission for me to protect the natural environment so as to keep the ecosystem well and protect the wildlife.

In addition, I have joined the School Ambassador for two years which is expected to tend the guests who visit my school. This activity seems irrelevant to science but it definitely teaches me what attitude I should have towards science. As an ambassador of my burdened and therefore I will try to communicate with various guests without being shy, although we might have communication problem with overseas visitors.



The attitude I learnt from this duty teaches me to keep trying to find out the solution, when I encounter the difficulties of science.

I realize the good attitude is always the main factor to reach the success and my attitude towards science will be one of the driving forces for me to reach the higher level of science and make more welfares for the society and nature.

Example 7

Example 8

One ability learnt from drama activity is imagination. In my HKDSE study, imagination helped me to acquire complex knowledge in science subjects. I believe imagination can also help my future study in science as well as researching in any science aspects. (too vague and hard to comprehend)

I like reading in my leisure time. Any type of book could be a good way of helping my understanding and creativity. Some books are about science; this gave me extra knowledge on science directly. Some are storybooks, which could stimulate both my imagination and creativity.

I am able to be very patient to things I like. I've been in school choirs for six years. It's is because I love singing, although practices is as time-consuming as any academic work. (Not really necessary to add this paragraph)

I am not strong in leadership. I've joined different courses to try to improve it. I finally found myself not a good leader. Rather, I found myself a good partner. (Not really necessary to say that. I would rephrase it by saying: I am a good team player,)I've learnt to be considerate and responsible. Therefore I tried to attend Chemistry Olympiad as a partnership team. I am well acquired with the sense of cooperation and being responsible. Project works were once my weakest field of work. In my junior form, I always get a low grade in projects. However, being a drama club committee member in S.4 enabled me to learn more skills in doing projects, as well as gaining confidence with my own work. And this would help me in any tertiary studies, which require projects rather than homework.

May student in Hong Kong think aspect of studying pure science may not be as good as other subjects. (Sorry, I can't quite catch the meaning of this sentence)But I think studying Mathematics contributes the career of global technology development and it is another reason why I want to choose Mathematics in tertiary education.

Example 9

I am interested in engineering. Maybe my result is not very good in public exam (Not relevant as the student has yet to take the HKDSE), but I have great interest in engineering and I know I will be an engineer in future.

I have studies Computer Studies, Physics and Pure Maths. So logical thinking mine has been developed during form 4 to form 7 (6?) period.



In my school, I have joined many outer school competitions such as Computer Program Design competition and Thinking and Art subject. And I worked as a committeeman of one of Houses in my school.

From all the above competitions, I have acquired the responsibility, leadership, solving the problems with a clear mind independently and how to operate with others well and sportsmanship also. These provide my confidence on studying engineering and getting a degree in it.

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Example 8 can be a good statement if the applicant can further elaborate the linkage between Maths and every aspect of our daily lives. However, it contains a lot of vague sentences which give negative impression to the Admission Officers that the applicant doesn't have a logical and organized thinking. There is no need to put everything in the statement, be focused and concise.

Example 9 is too short, too brief and lack of focus.

Admission Officer 2:

In both Examples 8 and 9, the writers have made a series of statements which are not supported by details or examples. There is also a lack of organization or central theme or focus in these two self accounts. This gives the impression that the writers have not seriously considered their programme choices.

Admission Officer 4:

Example 8: basically alright, but the contents could be made more precise and concise.

Example 10 is OK but it's like putting a bit of everything together and there's a lack of clear focus/uniqueness that differentiates the applicant from others

On Business, Accounting and Financial Studies

Example 10

I am determined to apply for programs about Financial Studies in my tertiary education.

My friends always describe me as a self-motivated person. I always take the initiative in learning new things. I enjoy reading different sorts of books which helped broaden my horizons and enrich my mind. Apart from that, I like reading newspapers, especially the editorials. All these help enable me to understand deeply about social issues such as the financial tsunami and develop a critical mind and analytical skills.



I am also enthusiastic about helping people. I love doing voluntary work. I participated in flag-selling and rattle ticket selling for charities. As a committee member of the Academic Leaders, I was responsible to help some lower form students with academic difficulties. I met the students every week and provided academic advice. I also tried to improve their self-esteem and encourage them to study hard. Through the activities, I became more patient and responsible.

My life in secondary school is heavily involved in extra-curricular activities. Being in charge of the Current Affairs Club, I acquired important skills in organizing activities. I also gain much invaluable experience in dealing with adversities and making final decisions. Besides, as the Secretary of Odyssey of Mind Club, I leant how to work as a team and communicate with others to solve problems.

To strike a balance between work and play, I have developed various interests. I love singing and I was a member of the School Choir in junior forms. Taking part in Hong Kong Schools Music Festival equipped me with more confidence. Besides, I like playing chess which help me develop a logical mind. Swimming and riding bicycles are also my hobbies. I will definitely seize the opportunities to take part in different extracurricular activities so as to learn outside the classroom.

I have a strong passion for jobs related to finance. I wish to work in an investment bank or a commercial bank. My ultimate career goal is to join the HKMA or SFC as a regulator in order to help maintain the stability of the financial market in Hong Kong and prevent the next financial crisis. As a Hong Kong citizen, I think it is my responsibility to maintain Hong Kong's status as an international financial centre, which in turn benefit the whole country through economic activities. I believe that your programme provides what I need to pursue my career and to contribute to society. I will cherish the opportunity of getting tertiary education and participate fully in university life.

Example 11

Example 12

隨着成長,學習的更多,漸漸學會了什麼是金錢,什麼是股票,什麼是市場,亦發現在繼續升學中有着不同的分支。在經過多次的考慮,我決定報考環球經濟,學會世界經濟,為不同企業,甚至國家作 貢獻,在理想的路上更進一步。

如今,希望我可以入讀大學中的環經濟學系,在這一目標、興趣上走得更遠。如果將來我可成功入讀,以後定會更用心的爭取進步,成為專業人士中的一員,貢獻更多。

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Example 10 is a systematic writing, step-by-step and well organized, though some of the descriptions about his/her personal interest can be shortened.

Example 11 has confused the study of Accounting with Book-keeping. It shows that the applicant should do some research on his/her favourable subject discipline before writing the statement.

Example 12 is a concise statement. Similarly, the applicant shall do some research on the discipline of global economics which can help enrich the content of the statement.

Admission Officer 2:

In Example 10, the writer made an attempt to illustrate his/ her involvement in a range of activities. However, it is difficult to see how these are related to the chosen discipline or career plan. Also, it is difficult to see that he/ she has acquired a basic understanding of the discipline.

Similarly, Example 12 seems quite superficial and it is difficult to see from the vague statements that the writer has given serious thought to the chosen programme.

While Example 11 is quite short, the writer illustrates with an interesting example how he/ she comes to appreciate the importance of accounting. The self-account shows that the writer has some level of understanding the profession.

Admission Officer 4:

Example 11 & 12 tell just one single point about why he/she interested in ACCT/ECON, but we know nothing about the applicant after reading

On Legal Studies

Example 13

I believe I am possessed of the ability and interest of studying law.

Since S.4, a passion for law has grown in me and I started to visit the court. Nature of cases varies greatly, from winding up petitions to murder cases. Nonetheless, I enjoy listening to various court hearings and this confirmed my interest in law. One case which lasted for months impressed me the most. Ten barristers



participated in this case which was about illegal trafficking of tobacco. They presented the speech gracefully and answered the judge's questions without hesitations. I dreamed one day I can stand there and be a prosecutor to fight for justice.

I have got the ability to study law in my university life. Throughout my secondary schooll years, I have practiced public speaking and writing debate speech inside and outside classrooms. This year, I have joined the youth Internet governance forum at which I prepared a speech to express my views on Internet privacy in English. I presented my arguments in front of my peers and the guests from the USA. Now I am the NetMission Ambassador representing the Hong Kong youth to exchange views on internet issues at overseas forum. By this kind of training in these 6 years, I learned about the etiquette of speaking in debate and the skills of agreeing and disproving. I am also able to think from different perspectives and sort out the useful information in tons of documents. The above skills and experience definitely helps my future study in law.

If I have the honour to be admitted, I have great expectation to my life in studying here. Being a self-motivated and diligent student, I believe one day I can have the chance to represent the university to join various territory-wide and international mooting competitions to practice what I have learnt and to widen my horizon.

Comment:

On Art and Music Example 14

我喜歡藝術,亦喜歡與人相處。在初中,我是一名銀樂步操隊之成員,喜歡透過社會服務接觸人群, 也在樂團的練習及表演中發現了對待藝術的態度,在過程中,我學習很多解決問題的方法,也提升了 我在待人接物方面的技巧。這些經驗豐富了我的學習,對我的研習奠定了深遠的影響。

在樂團的練習及表演活動過程中,我不斷學會新的技術,在團體練習中,我明白到每個聲部都要和諧地融合起來,並不能像獨奏般中一枝獨秀,也漸漸地對樂曲的技巧及背後的意義有更大的執著。在表演活動中,經常要面對不同階層的人士,亦要與不同的樂團切磋技巧。如中四參加的一次社區大型活動中(Shall give the title of this event),要面對不少政經界人士,難免有點緊張。幸好從前有參與多次演出的經驗,在該活動中亦表現自信。活動後更有機會與政經界人士閒聊數句,令自己面對世界不同人士亦不會感到靦腆。這也養成我比較外向,社交手腕強的個性。(Not relevant) 在中四期間,我首次參加了樂隊敲擊部的比賽,練習過程中,除了熟練自己的部分,亦有參與舞步及視覺



效果的設計。這給了我大量發揮創意的空間,同時讓我學會如何在表達自己個性和樂曲背後意義取得 平衡。這些活動令我在藝術上的造詣有更大的提升。

在這個課外活動中,步操練習及行政處理也是我的責任之一。在步操訓練中,我們必須在比賽前不斷練習。這項練習講求隊員的合作性和一致性,所以在練習中,我們要遷就別人,同時也要守著步操應有的原則。在中五時,我有幸擔任隊長一職,負責隊中的後援工作。雖然這個職責的緊要性不比其他工作高,但也令我知道所有工作的準備功夫是非常重要,不能臨急抱佛腳。當隊長期間,也學會了如何領導下屬和讓他們有效率地工作。下屬是專才,而領導者則是一位通才,不能每樣事情都往身上扛,否則會失去領導威嚴。在團隊中,也必須學會與人磋商,滿足別人要求時亦不失自己的個性和原則,是我在這個課外活動中學到最大的一點。

Example 15

我自小就對音樂產生濃厚的興趣,小時候每當客廳裏播放着懷舊的經典金曲,即便是頭一次聽到的旋律,已經會不由自主哼了起來,令我對音樂有了初步的認識。

跟入小學階段,我開始發掘自己的音樂潛能,參加了合唱團,使我更發現音樂的奇妙,唱歌的技巧並不如我想像般簡單。直到小學五年級,我被老師推薦參加校外的合唱團。從那時開始,我從未離開樂團。不但在唱歌技巧方面,更是與人相處融洽的交流模式,我曾到國外參加國際合唱節,包括加拿大、韓國和台灣等,果然「一山還有一山高」,到了國外,才真真正正明白自己是如此微不足道,其他國家的隊伍超乎我們的想像,不禁拍手叫好,同時我們通過了聲音認識了其他國家的朋友,雖然我們不能以相同的語言溝通,但我們卻能以歌聲,歡欣快樂的氣氛表達出我們對他們的喜愛和感謝。我們相處得融洽全是因為這美妙的聲音,音樂是如此能表達出喜樂、歡欣。

即便以上大大小小的經歷對我對音樂產生了濃厚的興趣,但音樂的知識數之不盡,天涯之廣闊,令我想探索這個世界的所有音樂文化,故此,我很希望能在大學修讀音樂,繼續發掘我的潛能,探索我的興趣,感受神創造何等奇妙的音樂。



Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

I have asked a music colleague about his requirement. He told me that he would like to assess the admissibility of an applicant based on his/her personal interest, skills and aspiration in Music. The applicant is also advised to talk about his/her expectations on university education. Example 15 is better in comparison but it fails to talk about his/her expectations on university education and why he/she has decided to study Music in university.

Example 14 is giving too much attention on the marching band. Some are not relevant.

Admission Officer 2:

In both Examples 14 and 15, the writers clearly show how participation in different activities has helped them develop and deepen their appreciation of art and music. In Example 14, the writer organizes his/ her ideas logically and illustrates key points with relevant details while in Example 15, the writer seems to appeal more to personal feelings. Both are effective accounts for their chosen disciplines.

Example 16A Version 1

I like arts and design; working in a field that is related to them was my hope since I was young.

In the past three years of NSS study, I have been trained to have an analytical and logical mind through science subjects; as well as doing everything cautiously. On the other hand, I have studied History and Design, and I started to gain interest in arts stream also.

Among the subjects in arts stream, I like design most. To be a designer, I know I have to be creative. Besides reading some books related to design, I started to think creatively whenever I am going to solve any problems or to make a product. A designer has to take care of needs of the customers; I also serve as a big sister to teach the junior form students and serve in the voluntary group in order to train me to be patient.

Of course, this is not enough a student today in Hong Kong, a student nowadays needs to be all-rounded. I took part in different activities during my NSS, such as the vice-chairperson of one of the Houses and participation in various art competitions. They gain me some precious experiences, such as developing my responsibility, communication skills and creativity. From this late July to August, I participated in voluntary work for over 100 hours, spending time to lead the old people to play games. I understand that I must be patient, calm and careful so that I will not ruin my work. I stay the same when I do experiments and researches in the laboratory.

I played various kinds of sports too. As a school volleyball team member, I have been trained to have leadership, confidence and patient, because lacking either one of them you may lose the match. I bring these talents to my life and I believe that with them, I can learn more successfully.

I am sure that I am fitted in studying arts or design. I am sincerely looking forward to having an opportunity to receive education in university.



Example 16B Version 2

Every young person has his dreams but most of these dreams do not come true. In my secondary education, I have been striving persistently to explore my aspiration fields related to art and communication and to equip myself for the profession through academic and non-academic involvement.

I am thankful to have ample opportunities for developing various kinds of interests and hobbies when I was young. Though I was expected to excel in all of them, I was gradually aware of my earnest interest in Art and Design. Engaging in drawing or producing a piece of creative artwork always gives me a sense of flow. I enjoy the process of learning more than the outcomes. I became increasingly sensitive to art works including the paintings in school and museums, modern architectures, and even window display designs in shopping malls. My enthusiasm in Art and Design turned out to be my driving force to take an Applied Learning Course in Fashion Design organized by a tertiary institute. I need to attend a three-hour lesson every weekend. This two-year course gave me an authentic experience in design industry. I was able to equip myself with the knowledge, skills and develop positive attitude towards the industry. I could meet and learn from professionals. Most importantly, I was successfully selected to be one of the 20 candidates to show our individual designs in the fashion show. It was an unforgettable experience widened my horizon and allowed me to apply various skills I learnt.

I enjoy meeting different people. We have a Chinese saying, "it is an art for us to communicate with people". Being the Vice House Captain, I needed to coordinate and motivate more than 200 students in our house to take part in various inter-house activities. I also taught lower form students the skills in sports, and debating. At the same time, I concerned about their study and gave advice whenever possible.

I was one of the core members of the voluntary service group in school since I was in S.3. The first time I experienced the satisfaction of serving other people in need was to lead over 40 schoolmates to design a birthday party for an elderly group. I could still remember the laughter and joy on that day. Since then, I joined various community services for different people, from kids to elderly, from local people to non-Chinese speaking communities, and from people in Hong Kong to new immigrants from mainland China. Working closely with my volunteer group partners assures me that patience, trust and humbleness are qualities we should have when serving others.

Life has been so fruitful in the past few years. There have been learning opportunities and challenges in my study and other learning experiences. Nevertheless, I am sure that the attributes, including a sense of responsibility, willingness to collaborate with people, and perseverance I demonstrated and developed through them have laid the solid foundation for my pursuit in further study and career aspirations. I am looking forward to a new journey of navigation.

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Obviously, Example 16B is better than 16A. 16B gives a more comprehensive picture with sufficient emphasis on the applicant's interest in VA.

Admission Officer 2:

Both of the writers for Example 16A and 16B seem to have focused on the quantitative aspects of their participation and experience, rather than on the quality of their learning from the activities. Instead of providing details on number of hours of participation, the number of participants in the activities and so on, it may be more effective for the writers to



discuss how the participation has helped them understand and appreciate their chosen discipline.

Admission Officer 3 commenting on Example 14-16: For the four self-accounts of students under "Connecting Life Experiences to Education Goals - on Art and Music", two are related to music and the other two are about design/fashion design. While 75% of secondary schools offer NSS Visual Arts as an elective, and only a few offer Music, the distribution of self-account subject is out of proportion. Better if a student self-account on visual arts can be included instead.

Out of the two Examples 16 A and 16B, 16B would certainly get the assessor's attention more than 16A. Nevertheless both examples appear fairly traditional and obviously follow a taught template: opening remark, personal development towards the subject, short elaboration on personal skills (in particular communication and some leadership), spare-time activities that underpin personal skills, closing remarks. Example 16B utilizes the template more skillfully, but especially in a comparative situation (as an admission situation would be) the identical setup becomes quite obvious, and then reflects back on the writers. Especially for studies in the Visual Arts, Fine Arts or Design, the assessor would appreciate a less assimilated, more creative, even potentially provocative even provocative approach. In both examples, an independent mind, certain edginess in attitude, even a convincing emotional urgency are missing.

On Architecture and Civil Engineering Example 17

Example 18

猶記得中二第一次接觸到力學時,我便對它著迷了。當時,老師出了幾個問題,問題看似簡單,我卻 總是答錯,聽到答案才晃然大悟,對我而言這不但有挑戰性,答對後更帶給我更大的成功感。

然而,讓我下定決心以成為土木工程為目標的卻是一宗令人震驚的意外。土瓜灣馬頭圍道塌樓事件, 一宗我所始終不及的意外,當電視影出一個個倒塌的家園,我明白到建築物穩固安全的重要性,了解 到土木工程系的使命,認清了自己的目標。所以,我衷心希望成為土木工程系的一員。



Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

The two statements are not very attractive. The statement should mention some great architectural buildings in Hong Kong (e.g. HK Airport) or overseas that have impressed the applicant. Preferably, he/she can talk about his/her most admired architect, for example Sir Normal Foster, etc.

Mentioning of the tragedy at To Kwa Wan is a good example

Admission Officer 2:

In both Example 17 and 18, the writers have attempted to explain their interests in the chosen disciplines, and to show that they have the ability or skills in undertaking a course of study in the disciplines. The two short accounts are fine but would perhaps benefit from more details demonstrating a deeper understanding of the disciplines.

On Health and Medical Studies Example 19

從小至大,我也十分喜愛照顧身邊的人。故此,我希望能進入大學中的護理系,幫助各個病人,貢獻社會。

Comment:

Admission Officer 1:

Can write something about the personal touch with the patients. This kind of personal touch is very crucial throughout the process of recovery or for those terminally ill patients.

Example 20

我希望能入讀醫學系,自小的志願就是當一個法醫。部分是受電視的薰陶,看過法證先鋒後覺得法醫的工作十分有意義,便自己再到圖書館開始借閱有關法醫的書,開始明白死因是絕對有跡可尋,例如屍斑位置,身上的疤痕形狀等。



MICHAEL JACKSON 突然離世,令我對這個入醫科做法醫的立志。面對偶像原因不明的離世,不禁輕嘆當中的悲哀。法醫就能幫助死者找出死因,協助警方查案,亦可作法律上的呈堂證供,協助捉拿真正的罪犯,也是對死者的一種尊重。

作為一個理科生,本人在生物科及化學科的表現不俗,自中三的生物課程的解剖老鼠課程後,令我模擬了一次法醫的工作,有感能掌握好解剖的精髓及技巧。對人體的微妙構造及死後出現的提示有進一步的認識及學習,盼能有幸入讀貴校的醫學系,將來能盡一己之力,為死者抱打不平,貢獻社會。

Comment:

Admission Officer 1:

The role of a forensic medical expert is more than standing on the witness stand in a criminal trial. It has a bigger role to play. May give the Admission Officer an impression that the applicant has not done a good research on his/her choice of profession.

Example 21

小時候的我一向體弱多病,可說是個藥罐子,經常在父母陪同下出入住所樓下的中醫診所,接受中醫師的診治。每次當我受到疾病的煎熬之時,只須一口口地喝下中醫師所處方的中藥,配以適當的休息,往往便能「藥到病除」,加上看到中醫師只需透過「望、闡、問、切」四診之法便能準確地分析病情,並診斷出所患何症,從而對症下藥。因此,我從小便對中醫學存敬仰、欽佩之心,盼望長大後也能當中醫師,醫治病人。

Example 21 (a)

Example 21 (b)

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

All these examples have one thing in common – driven by an inspiring person experience. In addition to this experience, the applicant should write a paragraph or two on his/her expectations on medical study, from various perspectives, social, moral, etc.

Don't know the reasons why these statements were all written in Chinese.

Admission Officer 2:

In all five examples, the writers have cited specific personal experiences which inspire an interest in specific medical disciplines. While some experiences are more dramatic than the others, they are quite convincing as the writers provide relevant, interesting details to illustrate how the experiences have shaped their thinking.



Impacts of Versatile Experiences

On Voluntary Services

Example 22

I have devoted myself to service the needy and the poor in my secondary school life. One of the most rewarding experiences is a trip to Guangxi impoverished villages. During the trip, I acquired many brand new experiences in my life such as planting on the field, teaching primary students and getting a taste of the Mainland high school student life. Also, I was much touched by their persistence in learning despite the poor living conditions. I have determined to help the underprivileged with my profession in the future. Other than this, I was appointed to organize two service trips in charities. Throughout the years of my social service for different groups of people, I become more sociable and acquired brilliant interpersonal skills and communication skills in 3 languages. Mastering the languages, I am made perfect for tertiary education school place over other candidates. Moreover, I have grown to be more mature in dealing with both individual and team work.

Last year, the Global Elites programme in July and August co-operated by the University of Hong Kong, Chinese University and U-Rounders opened my horizon to the world affairs. During the virtual G-20 Summit, our team representing the USA prepared a resolution on our views to various global issues ranging from medical insurance, financial tsunami to green policy. Example 23

In this period of time, I really learn much: I know that, share the happiness with others, is much happier than one happy! I know rather spend the time to serve the people in need than use the time to play the computer games! Being a volunteer is really worthwhile! In addition, in this all services, I found that I have improve lot include my attitude of people and things, I have learn to us another angle to think a thing. I'll continue my work as a voluntary even after I graduate from secondary school.

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Example 22 is better with substantial evidence in support of his/her voluntary experience. The applicant has demonstrated his/her ability to learn from reflection, showing he/she is a learning student.

Example 23 is too general, not evidence-based and fails to show that the applicant has learnt anything from his/her past voluntary experience.

Admission Officer 2:

Although these two examples show that the students involved have participated in voluntary services, very little specific detail is provided on how the experiences have helped them in their personal growth. The statements made remain vague and general and therefore not very convincing.



Admission Officer 4:

Example 22: The details and individual examples are good.

Example 23:

- The Example is basically alright, but the contents could be made more precise and concise.
- Too general, English needs to be polished.

acquired a fit body, overcame high peaks and worked with counterparts towards a shared goal. Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

The two statements contain a lot of details, especially 27. It looks like a composition essay but not a statement aiming to impress the Admission Officer. Too long and lacking focus. Remember that each Admission Officer may task with traversing as many as hundreds of statements and so, it is not recommended to write a long statement.

Above all, the two statements are too lengthy and clumsy. Not impressive at all.

Admission Officer 2:

Examples 27 and 28 are fine as a record of the students' own learning and feelings. But if the two examples are also used as self accounts or personal statements to support application for further studies or for jobs then there are perhaps too many irrelevant details. Also, careful proof-reading is needed if the accounts are written to be read by someone else and not just as a personal record.

Admission Officer 4:

Example 27: By writing about the student's extracurricular activities and life experiences, the article gives us some good ideas on the personality and character of the student, as well as his/her writing skills, which facilitate the admission assessment.

Example 28: More concise personal statement is preferred, e.g. explaining why the applicants are interested in and applying for the program, indicating their strengths/experiences that are relevant to the application. It is better to focus on the particular excellence about him/herself, i.e. tell why he/she is better than other applicants (the special things about him/herself).

Comparative Comments:

Admission Officer 1:

Admission Officers may like this presentation mode – simple, direct and to-the-point. Abled to reflect on each participated activity. I like this more than lengthy presentation.

Admission Officer 2:

In Example 29, the student focuses on a activity and reflects on the learning and insights gained from his/ her participation. He/ she shows quite clearly what he/she has learned from the activity and how it is related to his/ her future career/ academic plans.

In Example 30, the student has outlined participation in a wide range of activities, and has included self reflection on each activity. However, no attempt is made to provide an account of how these activities have helped the student in his/ her overall development.

Admission Officer 4:

Example 29:

The Example isbasically alright, but the contents could be made more precise and concise.

Example 30: The writing is quite fluent, though there are some grammatical mistakes/wrong spellings in part (3). Self-reflections were demonstrated.



Authentic Examples from Case Studies in Chapter 4

Example from Case Study 1 (Harold's SLP Self-Account)

Learning in classroom is not the only way for learning; I believe learning through extra-curricular activities makes me learn much more.

I joined the school Robotics Team since I was Form 2. In Form 1, I was already fascinated by the robots built by higher form students. I studied the mechanisms in the robot when I had time. I also read different programming books in order to understand the programs written by higher form students. Therefore, when the team coach invited me to join the team when I was in form 2, I accept the invitation immediately.

People always think that the robotics team member only learn mechanical skills, and maybe some programming skills. That is far from truth. In the robotics team, I learnt a lot, mechanical skills and programming skills is just the tip of the iceberg comparing to what I learned.

Knowledge is one of the important gains I get. I participated in a lot of different competitions; some of the competitions require not only skills in robot construction, but also skills in research. During the years, I did research in Nano technologies, renewable energy sources, human control on climate, automatic guided vehicles... These researches require high level knowledge in Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Control Engineering, Geography and also other aspects. I needed to read thesis, books, reports, and also interviewing different professors and researchers in order to find the information needed.

Another important gain is having many friends. Inside the team, I learned what friendship really is. We laugh together, solve problems together and play together. We care for each other and support each other. One of my best memories in the team happened on my birthday. I am not a really socialistic person. Therefore in my point of view, birthday is not a really important date to me. I can live peacefully without any birthday celebrations. As I just don't care about my birthday, I had nobody celebrating for my birthday (except celebrations at home with my family) from form1 to form 5. Even now I don't know how my teammates knew my birthday date. On the birthday during my form 6 school life, I was thinking that birthday was going to be just like the other birthdays I had. When I was doing my own business in the room, a teammate asked me to go down stairs to the playground. He said there were some problems about the robot which will be used in performance tomorrow. So I went down and what I saw amazed me and it etched in my memory. My teammates lit up seventeen candles on seventeen small cakes. When they sang the birthday song, I was really touched. "That is what friends are for," I thought in that moment.

Another thing I gained is experiences. My school's robotics team compete in a lot of different competitions, we also won a lot of these competitions and are often given the chance of representing Hong Kong to compete is international championships. I went to Atlanta, Shanghai and Tokyo to compete in competitions. These were precious experiences. These experiences are eye openers to me. It gives me better understanding to different parts in the world; it also let me know more about others cultures. For example, I know that Mocha and doughnut sold in Starbucks in Atlanta is the one of the most delicious items I had ever tastes; I know that people in mainland does not like to queue up; I know that most people in Japan does not know English, therefore next time when I visit Japan, I might learn a few Japanese beforehand. These experiences can only be gained by visiting places and trying to live like local people. It is precious and it helps me every day.



The next important gain is teamwork. "Robotics Team" ends with the word "Team". We are a team and I am one of the teammates. To cooperate with other team members is a really difficult task, everyone has their own idea and we often cannot meet to an agreement easily. This requires understanding of each others, and communications. The best solution to a problem is often the combination of all ideas given by each of us. In the team, I experience the difficulties in working with others. There is often people who have a complete different approach in solving a problem, their solution may have its own weakness but also its own strengths. Being in the team taught me how to cooperate with different people and how to combine different ideas.

Being in the team makes me know more about myself. A team needs division of labor as everyone has their own skills, their own knowledge. By dividing the work, the team can work better and have more efficiency. For me, my main work is researching and programming. When I work with my teammates, I discovered my strengths. I have strong analytical power, good presentation skills and a lot of background knowledge in different area, these makes me a researcher in the team. I also have good programming skills, good logical thinking and critical, multi-angled thinking, these makes me an ideal programmer. During my work with teammates, I also discover my weaknesses. I am not very familiar with different parts; I also do not have a good "3D-sense", which is very important to robot builders. Therefore I am not responsible in building the robot as others are better in this field.

Being in the team let me learn some important values. During competitions, I learn how to be honest, fair to everyone, also how to respect other teams. During preparations of different competitions, I learn how to discipline and how to concentrate on one thing but not being sidetracked. I also learn how to be optimistic and have fun during tense competitions while not loosing attention to other things.

Being in the team let me know how to share with others. Now I am in form 6 and I am going to leave the school soon. Other than being teammate, I am also a mentor of the team. New team members know nothing about robot. They do not know the traditions of the team, nor the flaws in the rules. They also do not have enough knowledge to complete the competition tasks. Therefore, being a senior member of the team, I teach these new members all I know, from scientific facts to skills to critical thinking. Being a teacher is not an easy task, these junior members is just like me when I was in form 2. By teaching all I knew to new members, the team can be as good as ever. Lastly, I would like to mention the greatest lost I had. Preparing for competitions is the most important task which the team does it every day. It is very time-consuming. After some calculations, I find that each year I spend at least a thousand hours to prepare for competitions. This consumes my time for studying, my time for doing revisions. Although it helps me to develop skills in planning, it still use up a lot of time. If I did not accept the invitation from the team coach when I was in form 2, I think that I would certainly have very good academic results. But in my point of view, although knowledge from books and teachers are important, they still cannot match with what I gained in the team during the years. If I reject the invitation, I think that I will be a "high in score but low in ability" student now. I would not regret joining the Robotics Team.

Example from Case Study 1 (Harold's Additional Information for JUPAS Application)

Since Form 2, I joined the robotics team of my school. After 5 years of being a team member, I had learnt a lot of things. The team built my personalities and let me understand myself.

Being a team member, I acquired a lot of different knowledge. Knowledge about robotics, such as robot modeling and programming, is one of the things that a learnt. During researches in preparing



for competitions, I also study topics such as Nano technology, renewable power sources in great depth. By reading books, searching on the internet, asking professors, I learn about these untaught topics. This actually let me to learn the skill of self-learning.

This gave me experience of travelling, also letting be to experience cultures in different places in the world. It also enhances my oral skills in Putonghua and English as I practice speaking these two languages a lot in the three places.

Joining the robotics team alters my life. It gave me confidence and it opens my eye. If I reject the invitation of joining the team when I was in form 2, my life and my personalities may be altered by a hundred and eighty degrees. I would never regret joining the Robotics Team.

Writing Recommendations for Students

RECOMMENDATION LETTER STRATEGIES FOR STUDENTS:

- 1. Choose your teacher wisely
- Admissions officers want letters from important subjects such as math, science, and English, NOT physical education, art, or drama. Choose a teacher who has taught you during the year the application is made.
- 2. Ask your teacher if the letter will be positive
 - Make sure you know that the letter will be a positive one by asking directly. If you feel the teacher is hesitant in any way, then back out of the request. The worst thing you can do is insist that the teacher write you a letter, only to end up with a lukewarm or negative letter. A lukewarm letter may not damage your application, but a negative letter will.
- 3. Give plenty of time
 - Give your teacher/counselor at least one month to write your letter. You know how many students they have, so be considerate and give them plenty of time. To give your letter writer enough time, it means that you need to start preparing your application well in advance. If you are very well prepared, you can ask for a letter before summer vacation begins. That way, your teacher/counselor has the summer to write your letter.
- 4. Get someone who knows you personally
 - Ask a teacher who has taught you recently. This teacher should know you well as a person, not just your performance in class. You should not ask a teacher who has given you an A but does not know you well. Remember that the "A" is already reflected on your transcript. You are looking for a teacher who can help make you an individual rather than pieces of information on paper.
- 5. Get someone who will write specifically about you
- Provide a background summary sheet for easy reference. Personalize the sheet to include experiences you had in class (discussions, activities, projects, etc.). Include what you learned in the class. The sheet should include your college plans, extracurricular activities, GPA, test scores, intellectual interests, hobbies, and other information that makes you different from others.

- 3. Support "big words" with evidences or recall specific instances that reveal the uniqueness of the student.
- 4. Focus more on the student's intellectual capacity and strengths instead of describing now "nice" the student is.
