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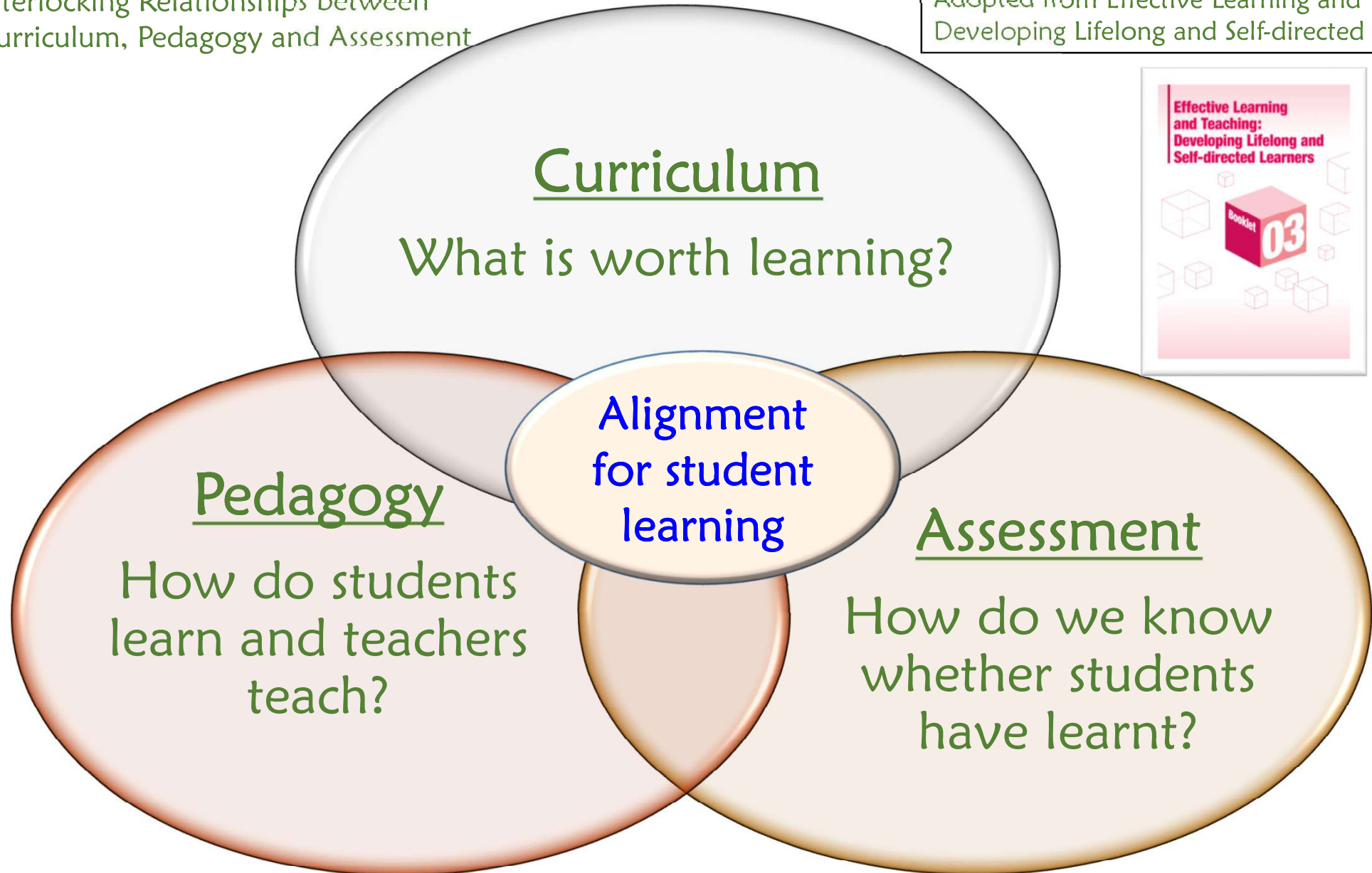

From Learning to Read towards Reading across the Curriculum

Learning to Read

- Learn to get information and ideas in text with help from teachers

Reading to Learn

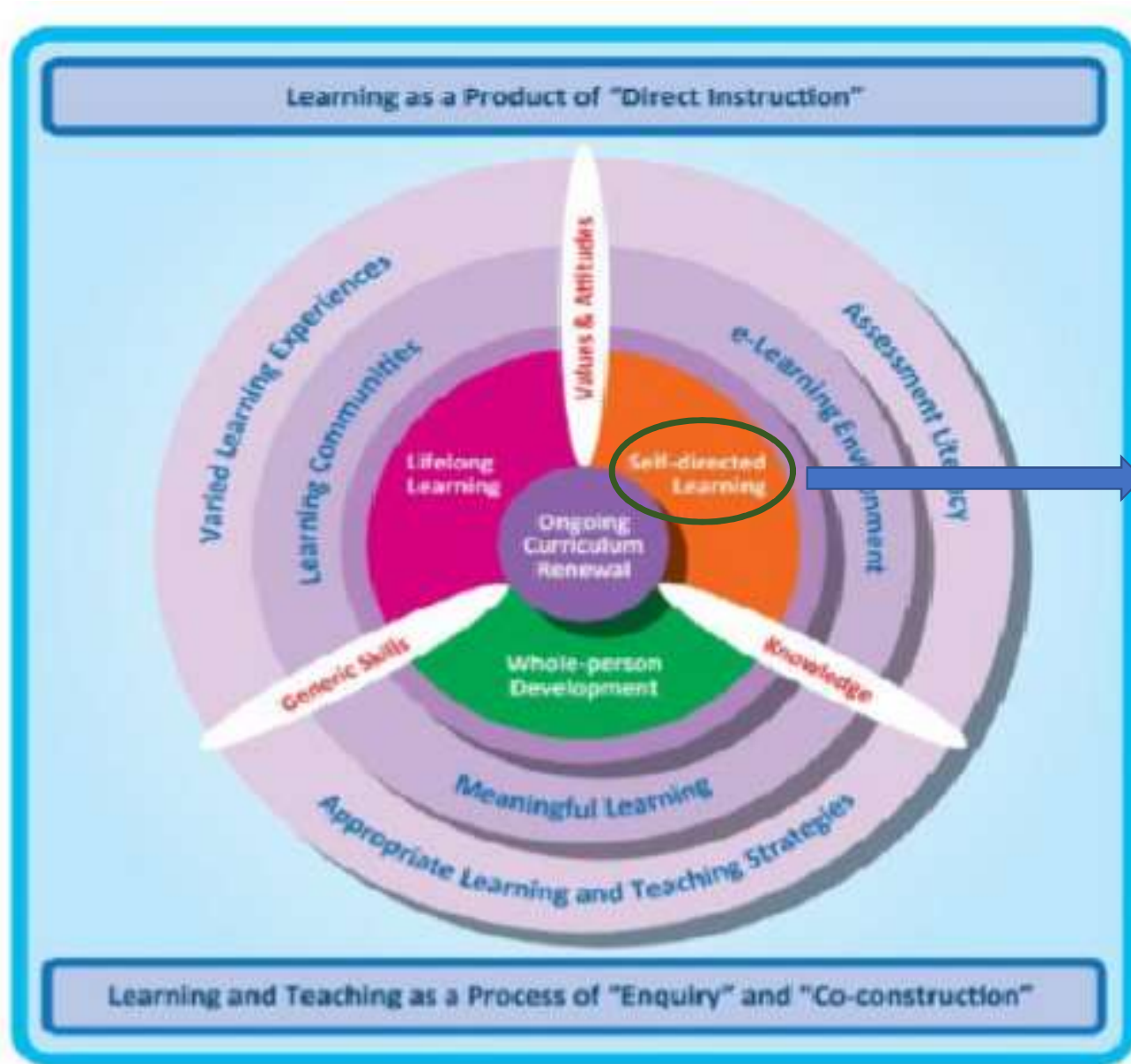
- Apply reading skills to acquire information and ideas from text independently

Reading across the Curriculum

- Connect students' learning experience and apply language knowledge and skills

A Conceptual Framework of Learning and Teaching



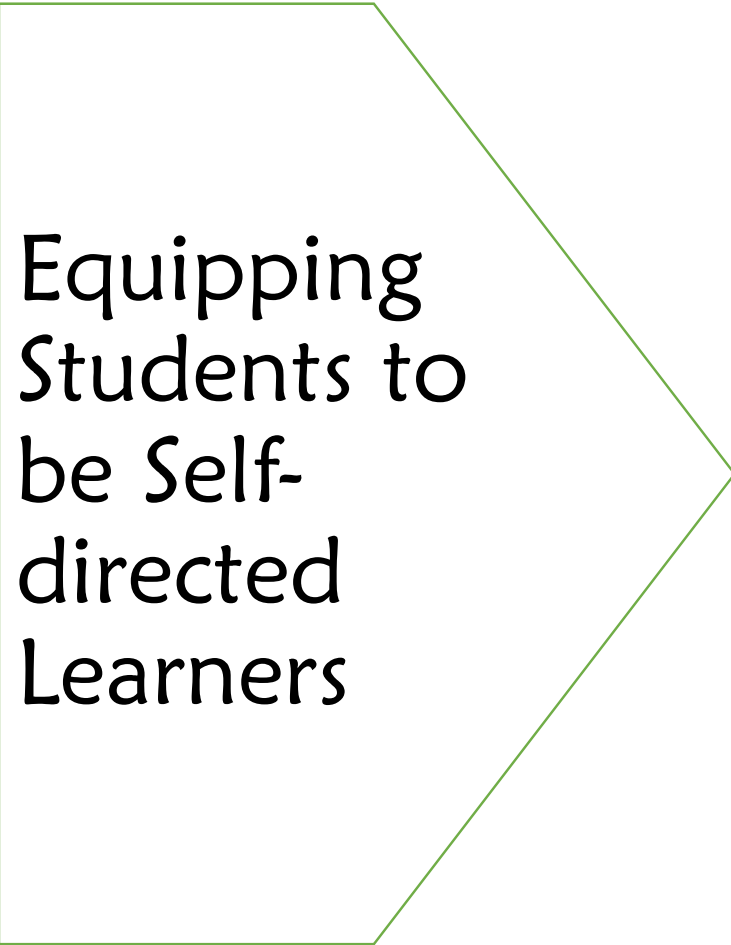

Myths about Self-directed Learning (SDL)

- SDL means students learn on their own.
- SDL means students learn prior the lessons.
- SDL is not intended for low achievers.
- The older the students, the better they will be self-directed learners.
- Teachers should allow students to decide what they want to learn when implementing SDL.

What is self-directed learning (SDL)

- SDL is a critical learning to learn skill and attribute
- Students are expected to plan, monitor and review their learning with guidance and support from their teachers
- Students are given opportunities to conduct self- and peer-assessment to monitor and evaluate their own learning



Equipping Students to be Self- directed Learners

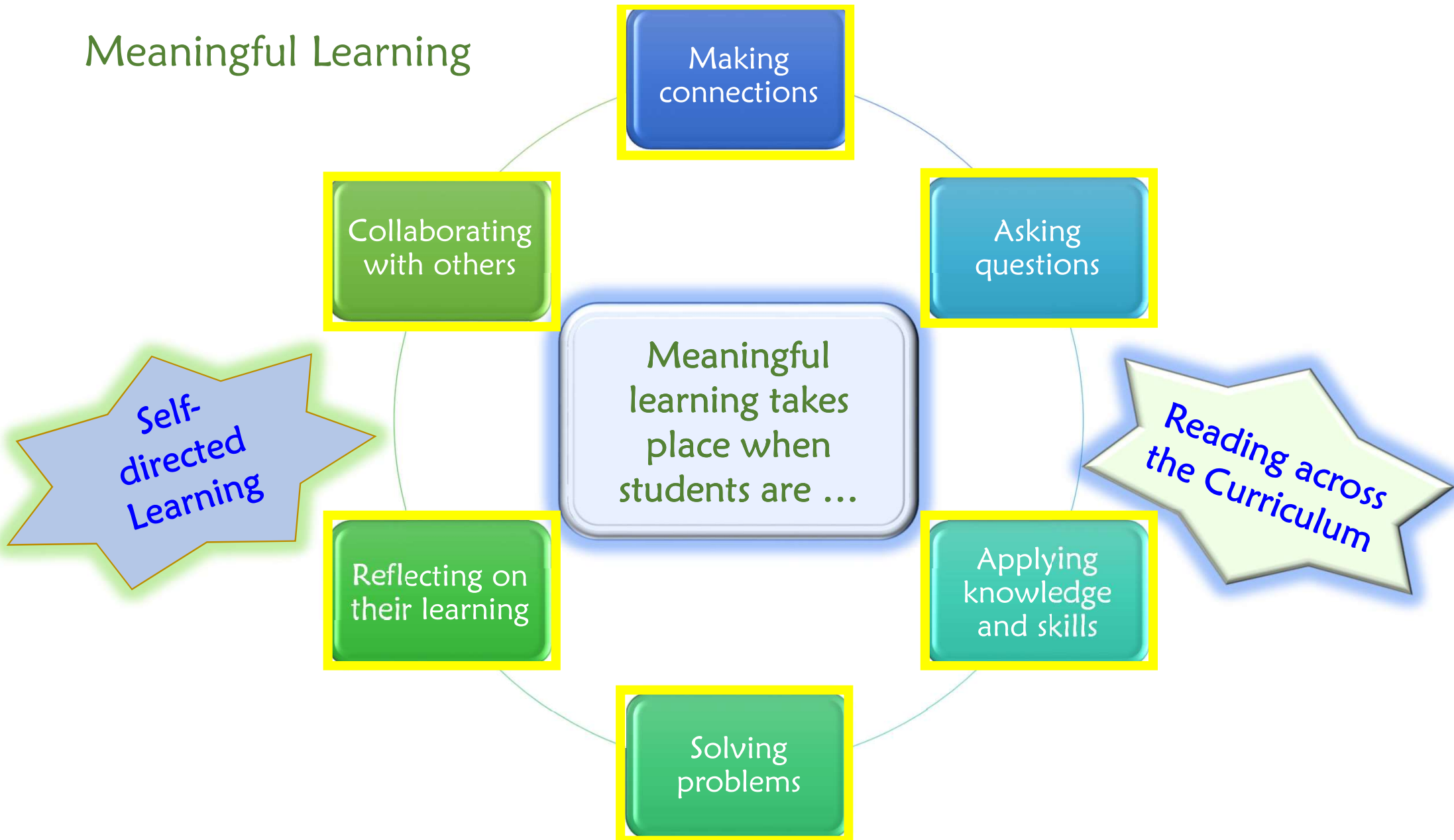
Learning is influenced by learning motivation and high self-efficacy

Students learn how to set goals, monitor and reflect on their learning experiences

After evaluating their learning progress, students identify ways to improve their learning

Meaningful Learning



How to foster RaC and SDL?

Reading a webpage

- Explicit teaching of reading strategies
- Model and explain own thinking process (metacognition)

Reading booklet

- Practise implementing the learning strategies by students
- Observe and offer support when necessary by teacher

How to foster RaC and SDL?

Independent Practice

- Students practise on their own to reinforce learner autonomy

Positive Learning Attitudes

- Be confident
- Be self-motivated
- Be perseverant
- Have high-efficacy belief

Pre-excursion Preparation – Reading Strategies

Learn how to search for information on **webpage** with **reading strategies**:
