




Comments from CIE moderator (1)

- ...allows a wide variety of exam skills to be assessed....this allows access to all candidates across the entire ability spectrum.
- In no question part did the number of marks seem to be too generous or too mean for the task expected of the candidates.
- There is a good balance across the Unifying Concepts and Nature of Science areas of the Framework.

Comments from CIE moderator (2)

- The (structured) questions are of an appropriate standard in that they provide an adequate no. of marks at a level to allow assessment of average candidates.
- There is a lower level of recall than I would expect in both Papers 1 & 2.
- Overall, the standard of the papers is somewhat higher than comparable UK AL papers.
